<u>Keyword</u>	Definition
Public Health	The health of the population as a whole, especially as monitored, regulated, and promoted by the state.
Renaissance	A revival of or renewed interest in something.
Epidemic	A widespread occurrence of an infectious disease in a community at a particular time.
Microbe	Microorganism, especially a bacterium causing disease or fermentation.
Anaesthetic	A substance that induces insensitivity to pain.
Antibiotic	A medicine (such as penicillin or its derivatives) that inhibits the growth of or destroys microorganisms
Vaccine	An antigenic substance prepared from the causative agent of a disease or a synthetic substitute, used to provide immunity against one or several diseases.
Inoculation	The introduction of a microorganism or an agent of disease into an host organism or a growth medium.
Dissection	the action of dissecting a body or plant to study its internal parts
Quack	fraudulent or ignorant pretender to medical skill" or "a person who pretends, professionally or publicly, to have skill, knowledge, qualification or credentials he or she does not possess
Germ theory	It states that many diseases are caused by microorganisms
Miasma	An unpleasant or unhealthy smell or vapour.
Aseptic Surgery	using practices and procedures to prevent contamination from pathogens
